Virginia War Memorial Announces
2nd Annual Virginia Patriot Day Ceremony
Event to Remember Victims of 9/11/01 Terrorist Attacks
And Honor Military and First Responders

(Richmond, Va.) Colonel W. Steven Flaherty, Superintendent of the Virginia State Police, will be the keynote speaker at the 2nd Annual Virginia's Patriot Day Ceremony at 12 noon, Friday, September 11 at the Virginia War Memorial in Richmond.

The ceremony, presented in cooperation with the U.S. Navy Recruiting District, Richmond, will remember those who perished in the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 and honor the military, law enforcement, firefighters, and other first responders who answered the call to duty that day. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

September 11 was officially designated as Patriot Day – A National Day of Mourning and Remembrance – by the United States Congress on October 25, 2001. The one-hour program at the War Memorial will include a special flag ceremony conducted by sailors of the Navy's Recruiting District, musical performances by the Virginia National Guard's 29th Band and the "Rising Stars" Chorus from Henrico County's Ward Elementary School.

The Pledge of Allegiance will be led by Robert C. Weiderhold, Senior Hazardous Materials Officer of the F.B.I. Technical Hazards Response Unit, who was summoned to the Pentagon immediately after the attack on September 11, 2001.

"Almost 3000 Americans died in the unprovoked terrorist attacks on our soil fourteen years ago. Of those, 115 were our fellow Virginians," said Jon Hatfield, Virginia War Memorial Executive Director. "There is no place more fitting to stand together and remember those men, women and even children who perished on 9/11/01 and to honor the service of our military and first responders than the hallowed grounds of the Virginia War Memorial."
