Virginia Veteran and Family Support (VVFS) provides a network of community based services designed to help veterans and their families overcome the challenges of deployment, military service, military transition, stress related conditions and traumatic brain injuries. These services are coordinated through local providers, including community services boards, brain injury service providers, VA medical facilities and other public and private agencies. In addition, VVFS provides direct support to veterans and families through one-on-one care coordination and peer and family support groups.



WHO WE SERVE


Virginia Veteran and Family Support serves **veterans of any era** and any branch who are Virginia residents, including:


Virginia Veteran and Family Support is here to help. We provide access to support services that are dedicated to helping you and your family move forward with your lives.

The VVFS Housing Development team promotes an integrated system of care through partnerships at the Federal, State and local levels to end veteran homelessness and support the affordable and accessible housing needs of all veterans. The housing development team is available to assist homeless services and housing providers to outreach and serve veterans.


