### **DMV Dedicated to Serving Military Members, Veterans and Families** *DMV 2 Go Mobile Office Visits Set for March 2-7*

RICHMOND – The Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles' five mobile customer service centers, called *DMV 2 Go*, are traveling across the state providing services to military members, veterans, and their families. Each full service office provides all DMV transactions. DMV staff can assist with services specific to veterans including applying for the Virginia veterans ID card. DMV offers more than 30 military-themed license plates.

Thanks to DMV's partnerships with other government agencies, customers may also now purchase certified copies of Virginia birth certificates, obtain E-ZPass transponders, and apply for their hunting or fishing licenses on all five DMV mobile offices.
