



Justice Involved Veterans in Virginia

Virginia Department of Corrections (VADOC):


As of September 2023, 3,556 veterans in VADOC (6.18% of incarcerated population):

1,519 veterans incarcerated in VADOC correctional facilities; 23 in jails (state responsible)

Average 400-500 veterans are released statewide from VADOC custody

2,014 on state probation/parole supervision (3.24% of state supervision population)

Lack of veteran data from other criminal justice intercept points (courts, jails, law







Challenges

- HOUSING, HOUSING! (71% requested housing/homelessness assistance)
- Veteran identification
- Justice service needs-more capacity needed to serve expanding VTDs
- Re-entry barriers for individuals being released from incarceration
- Local and regional jail discharge planning gaps

- Additional VJS position in North region
- VVFS Housing and Criminal Justice Coordinator
- Collaboration with VADOC Probation and Parole Districts/Reentry
 Optimization initiative (Chief Transformation Office)
- Incarcerated veteran outreach (jail-focused)
